15th Annual Mayor's Cup Regatta - September 06, 2025

Hosted by **Capital City Sailing Association (CCSA)** - jcsailing.org

Let's enjoy a fun day of sailing together... by participating in the **15th Mayor's Cup Regatta**. One design class racing in the morning (Flying Scots, JY15, MB), mixed fleet racing in the afternoon. The regatta was inaugurated via the "[Deed of Gift for the Mayor's Cup, Jefferson City, Missouri, USA](#)" (2011). We welcome CCSA members as well as non-members to participate - whether you're a seasoned sailor or a 'student' getting your 'sea legs' – this is a great opportunity to grow community on the water and onshore and to grow your boating and competition skills. Anyone who's won the Mayor's Cup three or more times can still race, but under the conditions of the [Leszek Vincent Amendment](#).

Club boats available: C420 (x2), Flying Scot (x2), JY15 (x2), Laser (full or 4.7 rig), MB, Sunfish (x2)).

See the separate **Sailing Instructions (SI)** document for details on the racing (link to SI to be posted).

Schedule of Events:

1. **One Design Class racing in the morning:**

- Skippers & Crew meeting: 9:30am under the club shelter.
- Races commence at ~10:30am (depending on wind).
- Minimum of 3 boats of a One Design class required to qualify for the Class racing.
- Scoring: Each boat's score shall be the total of the race scores in the class races. No score will be excluded.
- Note: Flying Scots will not use spinnakers during the Mayor's Cup regatta (am or pm).

2. **Pot-luck lunch:** ~12:00 (noon) Club shall provide meat; members provide side dishes (salads, bread, dessert, chips, refreshments, ...)

3. **Mayor's Cup Mixed Fleet racing in afternoon:**

- Each boat scored according to Portsmouth Handicap number for class.
- Skippers & Crew meeting: 1:30pm (13:30) under the club shelter
- Races to commence at ~2:00pm (14:00)

4. Award(s) for Class racing and for the Mayor's Cup racing – following completion of the racing results.

- Registration fees (for skippers; covers crew): CCSA members: \$20; non-members: \$25; children under 17: \$free. Non-members' use of Club Boat: \$30.
- Fees payable via [CCSA club website](#) (via Donation link under Membership button) - PayPal, Debit or Credit (add "**For Mayor's Cup 2025**" in the 'Write a note' window).
- Sign-ups on the day payable to Taya Walters (Treasurer) - cash (or check payable to CCSA).

What about the younger Sail Cube/Opti sailors (5-15y/o)? Parents – if your child(ren) has/have participated in the Introduction to Sailing classes and is interested in participating in a separate class racing event in the morning, please mention this in the Registration form (see link above) – we'll follow up with you. We would need to have 3 Sail Cubes/Optis involved. The plan would be to have a special course, likely in the cove adjacent to the dock, for one or more short races (Prize(s)).

Rules:

This regatta will be governed by the rules in the current **Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS; 2025-2028)**, the "Deed of Gift for the Mayor's Cup" Jefferson City, MO, USA, and the separate CCSA **Sailing Instructions (SI)**. Note that the SI may be edited up to and during the day of the regatta.

Deed of Gift for the Mayor's Cup

JEFFERSON CITY, MISSOURI USA

This Deed of Gift, made this seventeenth day of September, two thousand and eleven, originally gifted by Stephen Rasmussen, on the eleventh day of September, two thousand and ten, of the first part, to the Capital City Sailing Association (CCSA) of Jefferson City, Missouri, of the second part, and as amended by request of the officers of the second part, James Crabtree, commodore, Janet Weckenborg, vice-commodore, and Jamie Rasmussen, secretary/treasurer.

WITNESSETH

That the said party of the first part, for and in the consideration of the premises and of the performance of the conditions and agreements hereinafter set forth by the second part, has granted, bargained, sold, assigned, transferred and set over, and by these present does grant, bargain, sell assign, transfer, and set over, unto said party of the second part, its successors and assigns, the "Mayor's Cup" first obtained by the party of the first part at the second hand antique shop located on Missouri Blvd, Jefferson City, Missouri, USA, to have and to hold the same to the said party of the second part, its successors and assigns, IN TRUST, NEVERTHELESS, that this Cup is donated with the following conditions:

This Cup shall be used, as a Challenge Cup for friendly competition between sailors on the waters of Binder Lake, located in Binder Park, Cole County, Missouri, USA, through the year two thousand and twenty seven.

The competition shall be named the "Mayor's Cup Regatta" and sailed on a date annually as selected by the CCSA.

The competition shall be governed by the racing rules as adopted and established by the CCSA.

All competitors entered in this annual race, shall agree to all stipulated or implied requirements contained in this Deed of Gift, which shall be issued in written form as part of the announcement for the annual Regatta, and each shall set his or her hand in acknowledgment.

Any CCSA member missing the annual competition specifically because of any certain engagement, whether business or pleasure, located in the Commonwealth of The Bahamas, will receive a "Black Spot".

The winner of the "Mayor's Cup Regatta", shall be presented with the Cup, including certain contents which shall remain with the Cup for all times, as custodian, IN TRUST, to have and to hold the same, until the next annual "Mayor's Cup Regatta",

AND, the winner, including Skipper and any Crew, shall be compelled to select, one small item of their choice, to add to the contents of the Cup, and to deliver same, in a polished condition, with all the contents, to Binder Lake, on the date set forth by the CCSA, for the next annual competition,

AND, the winner, including Skipper and any Crew, will become members of a secret society, which shall, among other things, keep secrets from all other sailors, boat-builders, sail makers, mudslingers, clubs, countries, associations, individuals, governments, friends and enemies.

FINALLY, by decree of the first Mayor to preside over this competition, the honorable Mayor John Landwehr, on the eleventh day of September, two thousand and ten, that this Cup will be retired, but only after eighteen contests have been sailed, and the names of eighteen Skippers and any crew have been engraved upon the trophy, and then placed, as center piece on the mantel of the CCSA Sailing Clubhouse, yet to be conceived, designed or built.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the party of the first part has hereunto set his hand and seal, and the said party of the second part has caused its officers, Commodore and Vice-Commodore to sign, and attested by its Secretary, the day and year first written above.

First AMENDMENT

This amendment is made to the *Deed of Gift for the Mayor's Cup, Jefferson City, Missouri USA*, first made the seventeenth day of September, two thousand and eleven,

and shall be known as the


LESZEK VINCENT AMENDMENT

It is understood and agreed by and between the undersigned parties, Stephen Rasmussen in the presence of the Capital City Sailing Association, Paul Rudder, Commodore, Doug VanCamp, Vice-Commodore, Leszek Vincent, Vice-Commodore, James Crabtree, Rear-Commodore, and Janet Weckenborg, Secretary,

That on this 27th day of January, 2018, the Deed of Gift for the Mayor's Cup, Jefferson City, Missouri USA shall be amended to include the following requirements:

1. Any competitor who manages some way, through either "dumb luck" or skill, to win the Cup **three** times, whether in consecutive years or not, will be ineligible to win the cup ever again. It will be required, or great pain shall result, that any such individual is expected to sail in this annual event, unless serving as race committee, filming on location for "*Sailing World*", or has some other similar distraction.
2. Any such competitor as identified in paragraph #1 above, sailing in this annual event, will:
 - a. be compelled to fly from the masthead of their vessel, a dirty sock containing **three** rocks of their choosing,
 - b. AND immediately after each race start, getting well clear of other boats, promptly take a **three turn** penalty (1080 degrees) in the same direction, each turn including one tack and one gybe,
 - c. AND at the conclusion of all racing, and prior to the awards ceremony, provide all those competitors having requested, a drink from the cooler they will carry on their vessel during that day's races.
3. The Race Committee will provide redress to all other competitors not having won the event three times, with a scoring penalty awarded to the thrice blessed winner (or winners), that will be recorded as "LV" for the official finish of all races in the regatta. "LV" shall carry the meaning "Excessive First Place Finishes", and be scored a finish place equal to the number of boats plus **three**.


All other terms and conditions of the *Deed of Gift for the Mayor's Cup* are to remain in full force and effect.


